Definition

Timing is the Relationship between the Keywords of a Call and the Dance Action, measured in Beats of Music

- Command Time
- to say/deliver the command
- Lead Time
- Time (number of beats) between delivering the call and the reaction of the dancers
- Execution Time
- Number of beats to execute Call

Bad Timing

- Late Delivery of Commands
- Not enough Lead Time
- Stop-and-Go
- Early Delivery of Commands
- Too much Lead Time
- Rushing
- Clipped Timing / Not enough Execution Time

Factors Influencing Timing

- Tempo
 - Average Dancer should not exhausted, tired
- Environmental Influences
- Available Space
- Choreography Used
- unfamiliar Workshop Material / Choreogr. Suprises
- Dancers Familarity with Calls, Experience, Anticipation
- Phrase-less calling the caller uses the first beat of the music him/herself. No pre-calling
- Filler Words may become Killer Words
- Dancers taking too large steps, setting up too large squares, not taking one step per beat
- Unclear commands from caller
